Ndanu (not her real name), showed up at the Kizimani clinic in rural Kangundo Kenya with a migraine that had plagued her for over 4 days making it difficult for her to attend to her young children. Ndanu's migraine was a side effect of the Family Planning implant in her arm. She could not afford the \$5 fee to have it removed at the government clinic and had been suffering from persistent headaches for months. The nurse in charge of Women's health at the Kizimani clinic was not only able to remove the implant but also offered **Ndanu** several other options with less adverse side effects. Your continued support for sustainable development through Kizimani allows us to offer subsidized healthcare to the underserved like **Ndanu** and the 26 other women who showed up for reproductive health care in the month of August 2021.

This clinic in Kangundo serves an average of 200 patients a month 40% of whom show up needing urgent care.

Over the next 6 months, our plan is for the cost of operating the clinic to be fully subsidized
